MAREP AND FINANCIER SIGNS NINTH AIDE MEMOIRE

On Friday, November 10th, 2017, the Market Access and Rural Enterprise Development Programme (MAREP) Government of Grenada (GOG) signed the 9th Supervision Mission Aide Memoire with the International Fund for Agriculture Development (IFAD) at the Ministry of Finance, St. George.

The Supervision Mission was held from **November 6**th **to November 10**th **2017 "to assess progress in implementation"** by reviewing agreed actions; identifying programme outputs and outcomes; delays and problems; risks for programme completion and sustainability; lessons learnt; as well as, planning of exit strategy to ensure long-term sustainability, impact study and project completion report.
